Garry's Thoughts

Well, its Synod time again!!

Every eighteen months, there is a "gathering of the clans" as the soon to be ex-Moderator, David Baker likes to put it. But, what a different Synod this will be. For many across the state, the gathering of the clans will be replaced by the frustration of on-line, stay at home and square eyes from looking too long at a computer screen. So, maybe rather than the usual post Synod complaints about the bed or the food or the worship, there will be complaints about dodgy internet, poor sound, open microphones and sore eyes. Mind you, if you complain about the coffee, that's your own issue. For those choosing to gather in hubs, I hope our little conversation on Saturday has you prepared.

Either way, let's be engaged!

I feel that currently there is a lot of unrest around the Uniting Church. There are calls for the church to split into two distinct churches following the same gender marriage decision. There are calls for a non-geographic presbytery for congregations not happy with their current Presbytery's theological position and general unease about the shape and nature of the governance of the Uniting Church. Some are calling for a more hierarchical model, or at least are trying to shoehorn this model into our current inter-conciliatory model as expressed in the Basis of Union and often confusingly enacted in the regulations. Some are claiming that the model of our governance just isn't working.

So let me make a simple observation.

It was once asked what the main similarity between Christianity and Communism is.......Answer: neither have been tried properly. I think the problem with the Uniting Church and its governance goes back to the same old original sin; a longing to have power and control over our circumstances. This most insidious characteristic of human existence is the great spoiler of human endeavour and often the barrier we place between us and a God who wants us to further His Kingdom on earth as a loving community.

In 2 Corinthians 8:1-15, the Apostle Paul makes a plea to the Corinthian congregation to give generously to the poor people of the church in Jerusalem. He even cites the generosity of the Macedonians, who, despite their own poverty and hardship have given beyond their means to help out in the situation.

What is often missed in this passage about paying it forward are two vital things. Firstly, it shows the early foundation of the call for the church was to be unified, supporting each other. There is no doubt that the giving of money outside of the local congregation was a foundational part of understanding who we are as a whole people of God. In this way, "them", the poor in Jerusalem are as close as "us", those sitting next to us in our local church.

The second thing is that this a call for those who are primarily gentiles to give to a community who are primarily Jewish. And given all the argy-bargy about kosher food and circumcision and so on that fills the pages of Paul's letters, this is of great significance. There was still many who believed that in order to become a Christian you had to become Jew first. Its still pervades our thinking about the place of the Old Testament in the life of the New Testament church.


But, fundamentally, it reminds us that no matter what our differences, what our deep seated convictions are, what our personal feelings are, Christ's call to us is unity. We are called to work through our differences together. We don't beat each other up. Rather, in the spirit of generosity and self-abasement, we bless each other, and give what we can to raise each other up that we ourselves might be blessed.

This weekend, as the Synod meets, pray for our new Moderator, Rev Andrew Gunton, who God has called to personify this unity we are called to. Pray for every part of the church, even for those parts you believe have lost their way. Be generous in your desire to seek this very same unity and remember "there is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus." Galatians 3:28.
