Just before Christmas last year, we got a puppy. She has proven to be a barrel of fun with sharp teeth. The picture you see is just one of the many toys that she has destroyed. If we are not keeping an eye on her she moves onto other things that we do not want chewed. Oh, the joys of a puppy!

Today I wandered out to discover that she had somehow gotten my one remaining pot holder and destroyed it beyond recognition. Apart from the mess of filling from the pot holder all over the floor, I was unable to stay cranky too long because she just looked up at me with these eyes...

I found myself wondering how God does it. How does God look at the mess we make time and time again and not completely throw in the towel! How does he not just give up in despair as we turn away thinking we can do it all on our own?

We have entered the season of Lent and as we make our way towards the Cross, I often return to these same thoughts. Even after all this time, humanity has not really changed. We continue to serve two masters and often at great cost to ourselves and those around us. We put our needs and desires above others and expect a great deal whilst giving little in return.

We need this season of Lent to reset ourselves, to realign ourselves towards God's purpose for our lives and the Church into which we have been placed. We are not here to serve the needs of the few, we are here for all including the least, the last and the lost.

Perhaps this Lent we need to change our focus away from what we will do without and consider what will we give. We are invited time and again to be generous with all that we have including our time and energy. How will we give this Lent?

For some this will lead them straight to their wallet and perhaps it needs to but that is actually not what I mean. We are all busy, weighed down by many obligations and expectations. Part of the focus of Lent is about letting go, putting down what is not of God. What might you need to put down so that you can pick up what God wants you to do? What might you need to let go?

Preparing for Easter can be deeply meaningful if we fully immerse ourselves in the season of Lent. Let us embrace this season and open ourselves to God's intervention in our lives. Let us approach the cross with a new appreciation of what is required to be a follower. It is not only what we will do without this Lent... let it be about what we give.
