Christy's Thoughts

We are in an exciting time in the church calendar this month. Last Sunday was Pentecost and this coming Sunday we celebrate Trinity Sunday. I do recognize that not all get excited about Trinity Sunday, but it is an important day for 2 reasons. One, following on from the incredible events that unfolded when the Holy Spirit anointed the disciples, Trinity Sunday gives the church an opportunity to reconnect with the fullness of what God offers to us in the Trinity. The second reason is that this day is not connected to a particular biblical account and therefore is an opportunity for the church to delve into the wonderful space that is theology!

I am aware that many of you don't get excited by the word theology and some may even prefer to not travel down that pathway very far at all. Each year when I was preparing worship for Trinity Sunday, I would often wish that I could be away or get in a visiting preacher! In fact, sometimes I would start the week hoping I might get sick!

But I have to say each year God pushed me to reflect deeply and consider what it means to say that I believe in the Trinity. Sometimes I wonder whether people really consider the fullness of God. It is much easier to focus on each individual part of the Trinity rather than the whole, but I want to say to you that that is the point. God is not simplistic! There is no simple way to believe in God without considering the 3 parts. And even though many will argue differently, I do not think you can fully engage in faith if you are not prepared to struggle with what the Trinity is. How can you be a person of faith without believing in God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit?

How these 3 parts are together and yet separate caused me many hours of struggle and hair pulling when I was in theological college. Even now after all this time, I still sometimes cannot comprehend just how it all works. Thank goodness there are some who are much more theological minded than me who put into plain words what can be difficult to explain.

So can I encourage you this week to fully engage in Trinity Sunday. Don't put away the red of Pentecost just yet. Consider the fullness of God as you prepare for worship, whether you will be in the pulpit or the pew. Reflect on how all of God impacts your daily life and your faith. And may you experience anew what God would share with you as you open yourself up to the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
