# Congratulations to one of the Seniors of the Year Richard Hosking


He was recognised for his extraordinary commitments to **Townsville**volunteering at today's Senior of the Year Awards.

# **THE AROMA OF CHRIST(2 Corinthians 2:12-17)**

15. For we are the aroma of Messiah to God, among those who are being saved and those who are perishing—

Paul is speaking of the believer's witness as "to God the aroma of Christ among those who are being saved and those who are perishing" (2 CO. 2: 15). Believers have been "sent from God" for this task (2 CO.2:17). This commissioning is part of the stewardship legacy of our calling as "servants of Christ and those entrusted with the secret things of God," (1 CO.4:1). John Stott elaborates, "Mission arises from the heart of God himself and is communicated from his heart to ours. Mission is the global outreach of the global people of a global God. If then, we have resisted the missionary dimension of the church's life, or dismissed it as if it were dispensable, or patronised it reluctantly with a few perfunctory prayers and grudging coins, or become preoccupied with our own narrow-minded, parochial concerns, we need to repent, that is to change our mind and attitude. Do we profess to believe in God? He is a missionary God. Do we say we are committed to Christ? He is a missionary Christ . Do we claim to be filled with the Spirit? He is a missionary Spirit. Do we delight in belonging to the church? It is a missionary society. Do we hope to go to heaven when we die? It's a heaven filled with the fruits of missionary enterprise. It is not possible to avoid these things.

If some of us need to repent , all of us need to take action. The authentic Christianity of the Bible is not a safe, smug, cozy , selfish , escapist little religion. On the contrary , it is deeply disturbing to our sheltered security. It is an explosive , centrifugal force, which pulls us out from our narrow self-centeredness and flings us into God 's world to witness and to serve. So we must find practical ways , individually and through our local church of expressing this commitment."

In fact, for us to be effective evangelists we need to understand that the Good News is not a human invention , hence it was revealed to us so that we could reveal it others. We are not only to witness in words but through actions as well, by our attitudes and our lives , which becomes a pleasing aroma of Christ (v.15). Also , the Good News is not something we can keep to ourselves , but something we need to share with others. It's not a choice but an obligation. And the same applies to us .Once we have been affected by the Good News, we feel obliged to share it with others. Through the work of the holy spirit , people's lives are going to be touched by our witnessing.

As we think about it, here are three questions you need to ponder upon.

- # Do you take "the aroma of Christ" with you as you go about your daily?
- # In what ways might your ideas of mission and missionaries be limited and limiting?
- # How much do you feel compelled to share the Good News with others?

Then pray about it, how God should reveal to you the ways in which you can fully express you to share the Good News.

#### Hi all

We've had a request for some extra support in a few key Blue Care residential sites. Many sites are struggling at the moment, but some are in need of urgent support where these facilities are particularly stretched at the moment: Gracemere, Ingham, Yarrabee (Redland Bay), Nandeebie (Alexandra Hills), Maleny and Bli Bli.

We are wondering if we could put a call out to the local Congregations for support in these facilities. This would be "support for residents basically - talking, reading, supervising meal times ie ensuring the resident has their meal in front of them (for non complex residents), support for activities, COVID screening visitors. I think the list is probably longer but anything they can assist with would be greatly appreciated. "

This is an urgent need and any help, even one visit, would be greatly appreciated. The only requirement is to have a flu vaccination certificate, as per government requirements to visit an aged care facility.

With UnitingCare's DV alert program—a program for frontline workers which focuses on how to recognise and respond appropriately to domestic and family violence—we examine the dynamics of a relationship where abuse is present.

In a relationship where there is domestic and family violence, a pattern of repeated behaviours are evident and a power imbalance exists between the two partners.

Key elements of trust and respect—which are essential foundations of a healthy relationship—do not exist; this is incredibly damaging to the relationship and means the person subjected to violence does not feel safe, accepted or secure.

# **Update from the Moderatorial Candidature Task Group**

After deep and prayerful consideration, the Moderator Rev Andrew Gunton has decided not to accept a nomination for a second term as Moderator. We thank God for his leadership and pray every blessing on him for the rest of his term as moderator.

The Moderator Elect Task Group has continued to engage with members of the church in the nominee discernment process and has extended the closing date for nominations from congregations and presbyteries until 25 November due to two presbyteries meeting in that week.

Once nominations are completed, the Task Group will work with the nominees to prepare profiles and information for the discernment of the 36th Synod.


