

I wonder what home means to you. Is it about where you live and if so, is there a specific time period that elapses before this feeling begins? And if it doesn't ever feel like home what is missing? I think for me it is as the house begins to feel like home as our "stuff" finds places in the cupboards and on the shelves. But even more than that, home for me is when I shut the doors and find peace within, where I am able to retreat from the world and be with the ones I love.

Relationships are the same. At a certain point the people we are getting to know either find residency in our hearts in some way or we realise that they will only ever be an acquaintance.
