

Day 4 – Worry brings confusion

She could barely get out of bed, let alone lead a normal life. All day long her head was filled with conflicting and disorientating emotions. She would find herself sitting on the couch flicking through myriad television channels unable to settle on anything or looking mournfully at the kettle unable to choose between coffee and tea.

For months she had become increasingly worried about her financial position. Despite counselling that had helped her achieve a financial plan, she could not let go of the nagging worry that at any moment something would go wrong and completely upset the apple cart. Her worry became her confusion.

A person is said to be disoriented when they seem at a loss for what's going on, often with considerable confusion. There is often a subjective feeling of disorientation when a person has anxiety, especially during an anxiety attack. It's common for those with intense stress and anxiety to suddenly feel completely disoriented as that anxiety takes over.

One of the more common reasons for feeling disoriented is that you're suffering from so many overwhelming and rapid thoughts that you struggle to think about where you are, what you're doing, or your surroundings.

This state of confusion is often found in newly minted Christians. A sudden indwelling of the Holy Spirit can create a deep conviction about how a person is currently leading their lives and a strong desire to respond to God's presence. This can create, in some people, a mania of confused thought as they bounce between the joy of new life and the worry that they may not be able to deal with all the lifestyle and bad- habits in their life they believe God is calling on them to address.

I know. I was there once.

But, I had a brilliant minister who sat me down and helped me with some simple advice. "God has called you by name. He has called you as you are. Stop worrying! Just relax in His spirit and allow Him to make the changes He wants to make. Cast all your cares on Him. He wants you to be who He created you to be."
