A daily devotional by Rev Garry Hardingham

Day 11 - Ecclesiastes - A glass filled in the middle

Today we start a journey through Ecclesiastes. This is one of my favourite books in the Bible. Not because I am naturally a bit cynical....which I am.... but because it explores themes that are universal and can be engaged with whether you are a new Christian, a crusty old Bible-basher or just someone whose had a gutful of the chaos and confusion of the world. (If so refer to devotions day 2-9)

Its also really interesting in that, like the book of James, it somehow got into the biblical canon by some unknown accident. Even the name is a bit dodgy. Ecclesiastes in not a Hebrew word. It comes from the Greek, ekklesia, meaning assembly or congregation and actual refers to a member of the assembly. Meanwhile, the Hebrew word, תֶּלֶהֹ ק) Kohelet, Koheleth, Qoheleth, Qohelet...take your pick), comes from Kahal (assembly) but ends up meaning 'someone speaking to an assembly' or, for us, 'Teacher'.

Either way, Ecclesiastes lacks a lot of those common themes of the Hebrew writers, like a God who reveals and redeems, who elects and cares for a chosen people. And so it has this cynical theme running through it as if the Teacher has lost his faith and is struggling to find meaning and hope. I reckon in our current age, this is a common human condition now. We're institutionalising and rationalising God out of our lives and society and we've replaced it with wokeness and likes on facebook.....or to be blunt....nothing!!

Don't get me wrong, there is nothing intrinsically bad in giving a ten year old who came dead last in the crosscountry a ribbon for at least being able to put her shoes on, but, ultimately it denies the simple and hard-realised fact that each of us have to, whether we want to deny it or not, live in a world that refuses to stay at 25C every day of the year or not burn our house down the day after our insurance expires.

Ecclesiastes can be either positive and life-affirming or deeply pessimistic depending on your starting point. If your world is sunshine, lollipops and unicorns, Ecclesiastes is going to be like taking cod-liver oil. On the other hand, if your life is boring, repetitive drudgery surrounded by self-deluded misery gutses who drone on and on about their under-achieving family (photos included) then Ecclesiastes will be a happy place where you'll be saying, "that's right!!" every few minutes or so.

Either way, wherever you start with this book, I am sure that you will find hope and if you ask the right questions, it will renew your faith and strength. And who doesn't need that?

Prayer:

Dear Lord, thank You for Your written Word and the mighty truths it contains. We pray that in the power of Your Holy Spirit, You would open our hearts and minds to the truths that You wish us to see.

Prepare our hearts and open our minds we pray, and give us a teachable spirit that is receptive to all that You would have us learn today. Open our ears to hear Your voice speaking to us and remove any preconceived biases that we may have developed in any particular passage of scripture.


Guide us into all truth and prevent our own internal voices from speaking out of turn or drowning out the still small voice to Your Holy Spirit.

And should we stray from the truth of this passage, would ask that we would not retain any error but rather that we would remember the truth.

May we grow in grace and in a knowledge of the Lord Jesus today. Feed our hearts, by faith, with thanksgiving we pray.
