40 Days of Hope & Renewal

A daily devotional by Rev Garry Hardingham

Day 32 - Ecclesiastes 7:1-14 - Patience

A good name is better than precious ointment, and the day of death, than the day of birth. It is better to go to the house of mourning than to go to the house of feasting; for this is the end of everyone, and the living will lay it to heart. Sorrow is better than laughter, for by sadness of countenance the heart is made glad. The heart of the wise is in the house of mourning; but the heart of fools is in the house of mirth. It is better to hear the rebuke of the wise than to hear the song of fools. For like the crackling of thorns under a pot, so is the laughter of fools; this also is vanity. Surely oppression makes the wise foolish, and a bribe corrupts the heart. Better is the end of a thing than its beginning; the patient in spirit are better than the proud in spirit. Do not be quick to anger, for anger lodges in the bosom of fools. Do not say, 'Why were the former days better than these?' For it is not from wisdom that you ask this. Wisdom is as good as an inheritance, an advantage to those who see the sun. For the protection of wisdom is like the protection of money, and the advantage of knowledge is that wisdom gives life to the one who possesses it. Consider the work of God; who can make straight what he has made crooked? On the day of prosperity be joyful, and on the day of adversity consider; God has made the one as well as the other, so that mortals may not find out anything that will come after them. Eccl 7:1-14

Chapter 7 of Ecclesiastes starts with a long list of what is generally called "A disillusioned view of life. "However, I think there is a lot here to contemplate. But I want to concentrate on just one verse, verse 8. "Better is the end of a thing than its beginning; the patient in spirit are better than the proud in spirit."

We've all had experience of things that start with good intentions and end up in a mangled heap. War is especially full of plans that go south real quick. When World War 1 started in August 1914, everyone believed it would be over by Christmas. Four years later.... And I'm sure no-one thought Australia would be in Afghanistan for 20 years!! As with war, so it is with relationships. No-one gets married in order to divorce. But we know that 1 in 3 marriages will end in divorce.

There are so many things that we start with enthusiasm and, somewhere alone the way, we become slowly more and more disinterested. Or worse still, we come to a place of regret that we started the project in the first place. Too many of life's projects are entered into with a haughty spirit without due consideration.

I always laugh at how when Charles Darwin was weighing up getting married he wrote a list of pros and cons. In the 'not marry' list he wrote things like, *"Freedom to go where one liked—choice of Society & little of it. —Conversation of clever men at clubs— Not forced to visit relatives."* In the 'marry' column he wrote things like, *"Constant companion, (& friend in old age) who will feel interested in one,— object to be beloved & played with.— better than a dog anyhow."* Seriously?? Counter this though with the young couple portrayed in the song, *"Paradise by the dashboard light"* from Meatloaf's 1977 debut album, *"Bat Out of Hell"*, where a lustful desire forces a young bloke to commit to marriage until the end of time and then spends the rest of his life praying the end of time would come.

True success comes when we engage in a process of seeking God at all stages. The Teacher is telling us that to go in full of beans and then regret it is much worse than displaying a willingness to be patient and methodical in how we approach things. To run the race to the very end. Many a church program flounders because the originator leaves or the impetus runs out. The famous saying, *"Life is a marathon, not a sprint"* holds true if we can find patience and be willing to put in the hard yards over a long period rather than look for the quick solutions in times of high spirit. Great things can be achieved if we are willing to be patient and abide in God.

Prayer:

Lord, I am impatient!!

I know I need your calming spirit.

Forgive me for my impatience and for loving poorly.

For Your love is patient and kind and my lack of patience often leads me to a lack of love.

Work deep within me Lord when I loose my patience with those around me.

Reveal to me my folly and guide me in the calm and sure footsteps of Your grace.

For Your promise is sure and worthy of praise.

These lectures serve the Queensland community of the Uniting Church in Australia (UCA) and allow space for public theological reflection as we think together about the past and future of the UCA and critical issues of our time. 
