Christy's Thoughts

Over the weekend I was in Brisbane for a training workshop. On my way down and back I noticed that there were families everywhere. It wasn't until I commented about it that I was reminded that it was school holidays. What I found interesting about it was that in the few months since Jess finished High School, I have completely moved out of the mindset of school and school terms. You would have thought it would have taken longer to do that, but it really hasn't.

I wonder what else I have moved past without really thinking about it. I guess being involved in our children's lives means we are caught up in their comings and goings until all sudden their lives change. University is a completely different experience, one in which parents still have a role to play but nowhere near as intense.

This Sunday is Palm Sunday. It is meant to be a day of celebration where palms are waved, and praise is given to the Son of God who rode into Jerusalem on a donkey. As I have thinking about this event I began to wonder if those who gathered thought later about all that unfolded in the week that followed. Did they know what to make of it all?

The thing is that we do move through events in life without always realising what they might mean. I certainly have. I did give some thought to the significance of the last day of year 12 for Jess, but I didn't realise that all too quickly the years leading up to that point would become a memory not something that is front of mind.

What makes Palm Sunday so significant is what it leads to. It is a parade to be acknowledged and celebrated but it only finds meaning and significance when we consider what follows. The joy of that day is quickly forgotten in the events that unfold during the week.

I have probably shared this before, but Holy Week is one of the meaningful times in the year for me. I look forward to it every year. In years past I have led many services each night where we walked through the week, acknowledging, and remembering all that occurs. It is such a significant week not only for the disciples but for us.

That Jesus led those closest to him through the week knowing full well what was coming is mind boggling. Most would want to hide away and grieve alone. But Jesus openly shares and seeks to prepare those around him for what will follow.

The season of Easter is not one to rush through or forget. We should not pass through it without stopping to give due attention to all that happens. Only then will Good Friday and Easter Day make sense.

I pray that each one of us will have the time and space to fully appreciate the coming week. May we enter Jerusalem with Jesus. May we be present as we listen for Jesus' teaching on so many things. May we share in the last supper with Jesus and his disciples and may we be fully present in those last hours before Jesus is arrested.

And as we awake on Good Friday morning may we remember all that Jesus did for us when he obediently went to the Cross and celebrate with joy the day of Resurrection.

Reflection - Whoever is forgiven little, loves little

Several years ago, I complained to a mentor that my relationship with God felt flat, distant and like I was going through the motions. On top of that, I found dealing with people increasingly frustrating and my patience waning. I was still doing the 'stuff', like attending church, reading my Bible, praying and serving, but somehow the joy, love and life had been sucked out of my faith.

After about 5-10mins of this rant, my wise older mentor interrupted with some short but surprising advice that I didn't expect to hear. He simply said, "I think you should have a look at your repentance," "Why?" I asked?

He suggested that "there was something about getting up close to our own sin and failings, that puts us in a better position to experience God's forgiveness and love. And that once we understand how much we have been forgiven, it makes it so much easier to forgive others and extend God's love towards them."
