Garry's Thoughts

Luke 11: 1-13 Jesus' Teaching on Prayer

1 One day Jesus was praying in a certain place. When he finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples."

2 He said to them, "When you pray, say:
 "Father,
 hallowed be your name,
 your kingdom come.
3 Give us each day our daily bread.
 4 Forgive us our sins,
for we also forgive everyone who sins against us.
 And lead us not into temptation."

5 Then Jesus said to them, "Suppose you have a friend, and you go to him at midnight and say, 'Friend, lend me three loaves of bread; 6 a friend of mine on a journey has come to me, and I have no food to offer him.' 7 And suppose the one inside answers, 'Don't bother me. The door is already locked, and my children and I are in bed. I can't get up and give you anything.' 8 I tell you, even though he will not get up and give you the bread because of friendship, yet because of your shameless audacity he will surely get up and give you as much as you need. 9 "So I say to you: Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. 10 For everyone who asks receives; the one who seeks finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened. 11 "Which of you fathers, if your son asks for a fish, will give him a snake instead? 12 Or if he asks for an egg, will give him a scorpion? 13 If you then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!"

Who taught you how to pray?

Learning to pray is not like learning how to ride a bike.

Or to play a banjo.

Or driving a car.

Learning to pray is more like learning to kiss.

You learn by seeing someone else do it.

You practice a bit. Hopefully get better at it.

But you can never be sure if you're any good at it.

And the ultimate goal of kissing is not like learning the piano.

It's about building relationships

building intimacy

In verse 1 of Luke 11: 1-13, an unnamed disciple asks Jesus to teach them to pray.

What is he really asking?

Is it really about technique or relationship?

The disciples knew Jesus had a special relationship with God. They didn't quite understand the fullness of the relationship, but they wanted to understand how Jesus related to God.

So while the disciple might be looking for technique, what he was really asking was "Tell me about your relationship with God "

and Jesus does by teaching them a prayer that we now know as the Lord's prayer.

It is intimate, yet concise...like a good kiss, I suppose.

And the clue lies not just in the content of the prayer, but what Jesus teaches after it.

He relates God like a friend who you know will respond to your need, even if you have to be persistent.

Jesus insists that the God he prays to is open not to your technically precise prayer, but your heart.


And isn't that what a kiss is about?

So I know we are taught the Lords prayer.

But knowing the Lords prayer is not as important as knowing God himself.

Because knowing God will lead your heart, which will drive your prayer life.

Because in the end the perfect kiss is not the technique, but the relationship.

Do you lead worship or preach? If you do, you may be considered a religious representative under the Working with Children (Risk Management and Screening) Act 2000. It also means that you will need a Blue Card if you lead worship or preach more than seven days a year.
