Lorne's Thoughts

G'day Carpentarians!

Sunday, July 31 was one the best Sunday's I have had at Townsville Central and today I am going to share with you why.

But, before that, I need to tell you about the journey that preceded it. Back in December of 2021 our Sunday School teacher, Lizzie Henderson, and I spoke and prayed about what this year might look like for our kids. We have about 10 kids in our Sunday school program and our hope for the year was that they would take ownership of their Church experience while being discipled. While we didn't have an exact plan for each Sunday, we did start with two objectives. First, we were going to put the ball in their court and ask them what would make Sunday school more fun. And second, we were going to teach them about the different forms of prayer that we use both in the Sunday service and at home.

To the first point, the kids loved the question! They gave us a HUGE list of things that they desired which included everything from beanbags to a redecoration of the Sunday school room (including a painted mural!). Had Lizzie not helped curate the list, there would have been no limit to their imaginations,

Rather than saying no to anything, we asked them to rank their wishes and think about how much each item would cost. They faithfully did so, and then presented their wish-list to the council and asked for a spending budget from the church. One neat thing that happened, however, was that as the weight of the costing hit-home they realised that they would need to supplement the costs themselves.

This brings me to Sunday, July 31. On this Sunday, the kids left the service early and set up their fundraiser. While the congregation prayed for them, they dutifully set up their craft stalls, bake-sale table, hot-dog stand, popcorn table, therapy-dog cuddle parlour, and game station.

What happened next was gorgeous! All up nearly \$900 was raised by the kids but what was more precious was the interactions between them and the congregation. There was delight in their crafts, praise for their baking, and joy in the games, not to mention that I am pretty sure that for a few of our older members in the congregation this was the first time in decades that they had bought let alone eaten popcorn!

The kids were beaming, the congregation was energised, and everyone walked away with a grateful awareness of what it means to be 'blessed to be a blessing'. What started with a simple question, how can we make Sunday school fun, turned into a prayer-infused journey with a wonderful answer on July 31. I hope this becomes an anchor for these kids for many years to come. May they find strength in the knowledge that their church family treasures them and may this blessing aid them in their discipleship journey as they learn to pray for and bless the world around them.

Can you say 'Peace' in another language? – Multicultural Queensland Month

The Chair of the Multi-Cross-Cultural Reference Group encourages everyone to learn how to say 'Peace' in another language during Multicultural Queensland Month.

Rev Louisa Yu believes that the simple gesture of learning a word or phrase common across all cultures will help build strong bonds between members of the congregation and the community. Compliance with strict social distancing rules throughout COVID made shaking hands impossible, which is when Rev Yu said she developed the concept.

"We first practised greeting others by saying 'hello' in a language other than English to those who are not born in Australia, and in Aussie slang like "G'day" and "Howdy" to our Australian-born friends, which people embraced," she said.
