Stitches of support

StandBy Support After Suicide (StandBy) Northern Queensland is calling on crafty volunteers to participate in its new 'Knit-a-Bear' project, aimed at providing comfort and support to those bereaved and impacted by suicide. The volunteer opportunity running across Mackay, Townsville and Cairns will help to provide knitted bears for StandBy's outreach teams to use when supporting people left behind following a suicide, reminding them that they are not alone.

The pilot initiative was launched following discussions with UnitingCare Queensland's Volunteer Engagement Team about how volunteers could get involved with StandBy. StandBy North Queensland Service Leader Cindy Everett said Knit-a-Bear was a convenient way volunteers could make a meaningful difference to StandBy's work. From The Word for Today...

The truth about giving

"He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will also supply and increase your store of seed." <u>2 Corinthians 9:10 NIV</u>

Here is what the Bible teaches about giving:

(1) You cannot outgive God.

'He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will also supply and increase your store of seed and will enlarge the harvest of your righteousness.' (<u>2 Corinthians 9:10 NIV</u>) When Paul talks here about 'seed', he's talking about resources. Notice, some of the resources God gives you is to be used for your own needs, and some is to create '*a harvest of righteousness*'. What does that mean?


Paul explains: '*They have freely scattered their gifts to the poor; their righteousness endures forever.*' (2 Corinthians 9:9 NIV) In other words, you must show compassion towards those who are hurting and give generously to those who are unable to provide for themselves. The Bible says that when you give to the poor, you actually lend to the Lord, and He will repay you (see Proverbs 19:17).

Jesus said: 'Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you.' (Luke 6:38 NIV).

(2) You should be a cheerful giver.

You say, 'If I get more, I'll give more.' No, you have the cart before the horse. It's the level of your giving that determines the level of your receiving, not vice versa. So break through your barrier of fear and watch what God does. He won't disappoint you. Once you have experienced His blessing, you will never want to live any other way.

Each <u>Church Council</u> formally <u>adopts</u> the Safe Ministry with Children (SMC) <u>Policy</u> every year, and commits to providing a Safe Church for <u>everyone</u>. We put these policies and procedures in place to protect anyone vulnerable, including children. More information is available on the <u>website</u>. A new resource to assist with Mandatory Reporting

For anyone facing the challenging process of reporting concerns about neglect, abuse, sexual abuse or grooming to a child, you must follow the instructions in the <u>Template for complaints</u> and allegations and then complete the <u>Guide for Reporting Child Safety Concerns</u>. The guide will take you through the Queensland government's child protection reporting guide, to help you decide whether a report must also be made to child protection authorities.

Always follow the Mandatory Reporting Process for Ministry Agents, and the Mandatory Reporting Process for Lay Workers and Volunteers, which outlines the steps to take when reporting incidents of suspected abuse, grooming or neglect. This will ensure you are meeting your legal obligations and fulfilling your duty of care to the children involved in your activities.
