From The Word for Today...

Building Good Relationships

'Not looking to your own interests, but each of you to the interests of the others.' Philippians 2:4 NIV

Paul writes, 'Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others. In your relationships with others, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus.' (Philippians 2:34 NIV). That means do these five things:

(1) Be genuinely interested in others.

'Rejoice with those who rejoice, mourn with those who mourn.' (Romans 12:15 NIV) And you can only do that when you take the time to find out what's going on in someone else's world.

(2) Be upbeat.

'A happy heart makes the face cheerful, but heartache crushes the spirit.' (Proverbs 15:13 NIV) Though it can be helpful, try not to vent to others all the time. Make sure you remember to take your problems to the Lord in prayer.

(3) Be careful what you say, and always say less than you think.

'Fools give full vent to their rage, but the wise bring calm.' (Proverbs 29:11 NIV) And since how you speak is just as important as what you say, always be kind and courteous.

(4) Be reliable.

The Bible says, 'In the last days... men shall be... trucebreakers.' (2 Timothy 3:1–3 KJV), but you don't have to fulfill that prophecy. When you say you will do something, do it. Character is measured by actions, not words. So strive to be a person whose word has meaning.

(5) Be an encourager.

Barnabas was known as a motivator because he 'encouraged the believers.' (Acts 11:23 NLT) Ever notice what happens when you push a child on a swing? Eventually they start gaining some momentum and doing it themselves; they just needed a little help to get going. Even a smile can work wonders. Job said, 'When they were discouraged, I smiled at them. My look of approval was precious to them.' (Job 29:24 NLT) Sometimes it's that simple!

Safe Ministry with Children

Free online training for working or volunteering with anyone vulnerable

The Church has a primary responsibility to care for those who are vulnerable. All volunteers in Church roles, activities and programs supporting anyone vulnerable, can complete the free <u>Worker Orientation</u> training module available from The <u>NDIS Quality and Safeguards</u> <u>Commission</u>. This free training module must be completed, along with a <u>suitability check</u> to ensure that the Church can offer safe activities and programs for vulnerable people. **All prescreening documents are available on the synod <u>website</u>.**

Principle 10 of the 10 Principles for a Child Safe UCA

Review and continuous improvement of policy, procedure, and practice The Uniting Church is committed to continuous improvement and <u>review</u> of policy, procedure and practice. We examine <u>incidents</u> and reports to identify systemic issues and take lessons from what we learn. We have a <u>Breach Procedure</u> to identify and address breaches of the Safe Ministry with Children (SMC) Policy. We formally review compliance with the SMC policy each year to help to create a safe and supportive environment for children and anyone vulnerable. **More information is available on the website.**

Supporting Congregations with visiting Preachers and speakers

Visiting preachers and speakers can enhance and support the life of a congregation and its people. Visiting preachers and speakers have a responsibility and obligation to honour the foundations and beliefs of the Uniting Church. Congregations inviting a visiting preacher or speaker from another denomination require the visiting preacher to sign a <u>Statement of Agreement</u> to work within the Basis of Union.

The Statement of Agreement enables the preacher or speaker to participate in a Uniting Church service of worship. A copy of this document is available on the Synod <u>website</u>.
