Communities Innovation Fund: Responses to Social Isolation and Loneliness

The Queensland Government is investing \$4 million over four years in a new Communities Innovation Fund. The Communities Innovation Fund will provide up to \$200,000 per year to community organisations for innovative services that create meaningful connections for Queenslanders experiencing social isolation and loneliness.

The Communities Innovation Fund is a flagship initiative of Communities 2032 – the Queensland Government's new ten-year plan for supporting vibrant, inclusive, safe and welcoming communities. As a key priority of Communities 2032, the Communities Innovation Fund is focused on initiatives that combat social isolation and loneliness in Queensland communities.

Purpose

It can be difficult to make new connections, and to maintain them, especially after the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. We all need to feel like we are part of our community, and that we have people in our lives to genuinely connect with.

When people are well connected with their communities, when they have genuine and meaningful relationships to rely on, they have better health and wellbeing, and better quality of life. We are committed to helping Queenslanders experiencing social isolation and loneliness.

We know that community organisations are uniquely placed to help address these critical issues, with committed, skilled and experienced people working at the heart of their communities.

The Communities Innovation Fund is designed to provide funding to organisations with new ideas that will help people connect, reconnect, find and keep meaningful relationships within Queensland's diverse communities.

Through the Communities Innovation Fund, we are looking to test and try new approaches that could be scaled up or expanded in the future.

What funding is available?

Two separate grants rounds will open in early 2023:

Small grants

The small grants round is for short-term initiatives up to \$50,000. The total value of funding available for small initiatives is \$800,000 over the next four years (\$200,000 per year). The small grants will open each year for applications.

The small grants round will support projects like events, courses, innovative ways of creating connection and professional development opportunities.

Compassionate Communities is a globally recognised whole of community approach to improving the endof-life experience for people by mobilising local networks, groups and services to be more conscious, aware and equipped to offer support.

The Compassionate Communities initiative aims to empower members of our community to play a stronger, more confident role, in the care and support of people at end of life. Often, we don't have the right information at hand, which is why the Northern Queensland Primary Health Network is developing the health community connectors program which activates everyday citizens to draw upon their knowledge of local services and groups and offer that information to people that they come across who might benefit from being more connected.

'Health Community connectors are hairdressers, taxi drivers, café staff, aged care workers, teenagers, students, choir group members, community workers, business owners, librarians, social workers, neighbours, commuters.....anyone really!' ~ Groundswell Project staff

At NQPHN, we are seeking expression of interest from people to become Health Community Connectors who are community-minded individuals passionate about engaging with community members on identifying and signposting vulnerable people to groups, services and other supports that either formally and informally address end of life care, grief and bereavement. Some examples of these services and supports may include palliative care, support groups, social clubs, community services and any other type of helpful supports. Health community connectors maybe retired professionals, health or community services professionals, caregivers amongst others.

From the Word for Today...

Connecting begins with Caring

'May the Lord make your love increase and overflow.' 1 Thessalonians 3:12 NIV

One of America's most successful telephone companies created a TV advert using the slogan, 'Can you hear me now?' It shows a man talking on the phone, but the person on the other end can't hear him. So, he repeatedly asks, 'Can you hear me now?' The ad was designed to convey the message that this particular phone company delivers a high-quality signal and doesn't drop calls. When your phone drops a call, you know it. And what's your immediate reaction? Annoyance? Frustration? Anger?

In his book, *Everyone Communicates, Few Connect*, Dr John Maxwell writes: 'When I interact with people... I know I've connected when I sense extra effort—people go the extra mile; unsolicited appreciation—they say positive things; unguarded openness—they demonstrate trust; increased communication—they express themselves more readily; enjoyable experiences—they feel good about what they're doing; emotional bondedness—they display a connection on an emotional level; positive energy—their emotional "batteries" are charged by being together... unconditional love—they are accepting without reservation. Anytime I interact with people and I see evidence of these signals, I know I'm connecting. I've learned what it takes to connect... and... to gauge when I'm succeeding. How are you doing when it comes to connecting? When you interact one-on-one with someone important in your life, do you receive these signals? Even if connecting with others isn't something you're good at today, you can learn how to do it and become better tomorrow.'

But first, you must genuinely care about the person you are trying to connect with. That's why Paul writes, 'May the Lord make your love increase and overflow.'
