## From the Word for Today...

#### **Faithfulness**

#### 'Great is thy faithfulness.' Lamentations 3:23 KJV

Faithfulness can turn the most menial job into a vitally important one.

For example, think about how dependent we are on something as small as a postage stamp. It's always ready for service. It goes wherever it's sent. It does whatever it's asked to do. It sticks to the task until it's done. It doesn't give up when it's licked. It stays up to date. And it finds no job too small.

We weren't all born with equal talents; some of us are more gifted in certain areas than others. But every one of us was born with an equal responsibility to utilise his or her abilities at full capacity. That's the most any of us can do, and it's what God, who gave us our talents, expects us to do.

Two hundred years ago, when the U.S. Marine Corps was first formed, officials gave considerable time to contemplating a fitting motto. They finally chose the Latin phrase *semper fidelis*, a phrase now engraved on the mind of every Marine. What does it mean? 'Always faithful'!

Both are important words, but the most important is the first one: *always*. Why? Because a Marine can't afford to be faithful only when it's comfortable or convenient, or when they feel like it, or when it will make them happy. *Semper fidelis* means you must always be faithful – regardless of the cost.

God wants to be able to say the same thing about you as is said about Him: 'Great is thy faithfulness.' So whether you're a boss, an employee, a father or mother, a husband or wife, a friend, a teammate, or a Marine, the word for today is – always be faithful.

### Cutting through the 'noise' of life - Refocusing during Lent

"When I was a child, I would sit on my mother's lap, and she would tell me the stories of our people. It meant I knew who I was because I knew my story. "I'm so grateful for it because today it's fading away. It's harder for young people because of the noise of modern life."

Ever since I heard this from Kim Allen, a youth leader with the United Church in Papua New Guinea, a UnitingWorld partner church, I can't get it out of my mind. I think his words transcend his culture and speak into our current moment.

At just 28 years old, Kim is responsible for around five thousand youth across almost ten remote islands. He acts as a facilitator to connect youth to the church's work.

### Safe Church and Safe Ministry with Children

#### Safe Church assessment - Information request

Thank you for your continued and extraordinary commitment to the care of the children we are entrusted to look after. As part of fulfilling our commitment to the community to conduct child-safe activities, presbyteries have been requested by the General Secretary to work with congregations to supply information for a routine annual Safe Church assessment. Congregations will be contacted by their presbytery. The information must be collated and forwarded to the Synod office before March 15. Thank you in advance for your assistance.

#### **Annual Safe Church Audit**

The annual audit includes all volunteers, not only those volunteers in child-related roles. All volunteers must complete a <u>Statement of Personal Commitment</u> each year and complete training relevant to their role. New resources have been developed to assist congregations, presbyteries and <u>regulated businesses</u> in gathering this <u>information</u>. Resources are available on the synod <u>website</u>.

#### **Principle 10 of the 10 UCA Child Safe Principles**

Review and continuous improvement of policy, procedure and practice. The Uniting Church is committed to continuous improvement and regularly undertakes reviews of policy, procedure and practice. We examine incidents and reports to identify systemic issues and take lessons from what we learn.
