## Reflection...

#### Mark 5:34 "Daughter, your faith has healed you. Go in peace and be freed from your suffering."

In the Bible, there are many people whose names are never revealed. They may be described by their association (The companion on the Emmaus Road; Manoah's wife), their ailment (ten lepers); their background (Samaritan woman) or their shortcomings (Woman taken into adultery).

In the above verse, Jesus is talking to the woman 'subject to bleeding.' We do not know her name, but I am sure her neighbours had pet names for her. She was defined by her imperfection. She was a person reduced to an ailment.

She touches Jesus and she is healed. She got what she came for. So why does Jesus stop and call her out? Obviously, He had other urgent business to attend to.

But He stops, calls for her, and then calls her 'daughter.' There is so much power in that word. It is a transformational word. Yes, she is healed physically, but she needs to know that, under the power of Jesus, she has moved from a person described by her imperfection, to a person with a living relationship with Jesus. Daughter... we become not sinners but sons and daughters of the living God through the power of Jesus.

Jenny was an outcast at school. She had only one uniform which became grottier as the week progressed. She was teased and shunned. On the first day of a new school year, she was put in Mr M's class. He set them some writing task which they had to bring out to him when finished. When Jenny placed her work in front of Mr M's table, he looked at her book, then looked up at her and said, "What did I do to manage to get such a beautiful person in my class?"

Those words changed her life.

Jesus calls us from being defined by our imperfections, to being in close relationship with the living God.

### Safe Church and Safe Ministry with Children

#### Safe Church assessment - Information request

Thank you for your continued and extraordinary commitment to the care of the children we are entrusted to look after. As part of fulfilling our commitment to the community to conduct child-safe activities, presbyteries have been requested by the General Secretary to work with congregations to supply information for a routine annual Safe Church assessment. Congregations will be contacted by their presbytery. The information must be collated and forwarded to the Synod office before March 15. Thank you in advance for your assistance.

#### **Annual Safe Church Audit**

The annual audit includes all volunteers, not only those volunteers in child-related roles. All volunteers must complete a <u>Statement of Personal Commitment</u> each year and complete training relevant to their role. New resources have been developed to assist congregations, presbyteries and <u>regulated businesses</u> in gathering this <u>information</u>. Resources are available on the synod <u>website</u>.

Review and continuous improvement of policy, procedure and practice. The Uniting Church is committed to continuous improvement and regularly undertakes reviews of policy, procedure and practice.
