
Service of Remembrance at Townsville Central UC

From The Word for Today...

Be Joyful

'That we may sing for joy and be glad all our days.' Psalm 90:14 NIV

It doesn't help the cause of Christ when His followers go around looking miserable. You say, 'But I have problems.' Everybody does.

When the apostle Paul was in prison, he wrote, 'Rejoice in the Lord always' (Philippians 4:4 NIV). Expressing joy is something you do in spite of your circumstances, not because of them. The Bible says, 'With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation' (Isaiah 12:3 NIV).

God has put a well of joy within you, but you have to draw it out and share it with others. Joy is contagious. Happiness travels through relational networks like ripples on a pond. It's so robust, in fact, that it can permeate three degrees of separation. That means *your* happiness quotient is more likely to increase when a friend of a friend becomes happy.

We hunger for joy. 'Satisfy us in the morning,' writes the psalmist – but not with more money or power or applause. No, 'Satisfy us in the morning with your unfailing love, that we may sing for joy and be glad all our days' (Psalm 90:14 NIV). Joyful people make us come alive.

The Bible says, 'The joy of the LORD is your strength' (Nehemiah 8:10 NIV). We love joy, but often we forget how powerful it is. Joy gives us the strength to resist temptation. It gives us the ability to persevere. It's the Velcro that makes relationships stick. It gives us the energy to love. We don't just need air, food, and water; we need joy. And the person who brings it is like an oasis in a desert land. So today, be joyful.

Torres Strait Islands Embrace Coming of the Light: A Celebration of Faith, Culture, and Resilience

In the Torres Strait Islands, a diverse community prepares to honour their rich heritage through the annual Coming of the Light celebration. This deeply significant event, commemorated on July 1st, embraces the fusion of faith, culture, and resilience within the island communities.

The Coming of the Light holds a profound place in the hearts of Torres Strait Islanders, symbolising the positive transformation brought forth by the gospel. The arrival of Reverend Samuel Macfarlane on Erub (Darnley) Island in 1871 kindled the introduction of Christianity in the region. This event not only reshaped religious practices but also influenced the cultural traditions of the Torres Strait Islanders.

Among those reflecting on the celebration's importance is Aunty Annai Ghee, a devout Christian woman with deep roots in Torres Strait culture. Her father, Pinau, was born on Murray Island, while her mother, Jacynthia, hails from a South Sea Islander background. Annai recalls the impact her Preacher Grandfather Sterling had on her. She recalls great memories in his church meetings and experiencing God's love in her young years.
