Church Planting and Rebuilding Workshop

The Moreton Rivers Presbytery has a strategic commitment to church planting. As a church planter, I know that effective leadership is pivotal to a start up faith community or congregation. Therefore, the Presbytery has developed a leadership pathway for planting churches and rebuilding congregations. The Intensive will run in two parts. The first part will be run on June 17th and 18th. The second part will run on October 8th-10th. The total cost for this 5 day workshop will be \$200. The sessions will run from 9.30am-3:30pm with morning tea, and lunch provided. The information session and the intensive are open to people from and beyond the Moreton Rivers Presbytery.

This course taps into the pressing need within the UCA to raise up leaders who can launch new church plants or rebuild congregations as vibrant missional communities of faith in this day and age. The two part intensive is focused on equipping people to lead or be a part of a core team that plants a church or rebuilds a congregation. It is part of the overall leadership pathway for church planting across numerous presbyteries in the Qld Synod.

Events funded under the CMQ program will:

- increase a sense of belonging by people from a culturally and linguistically diverse background;
- improve feelings of social inclusion by people from a culturally and linguistically diverse background; and/or
- increase intercultural connections between people from various backgrounds.

Eligible applicants can apply for **one-off funding of up to \$20,000** for cultural and multicultural events to be delivered in the 2025 calendar year.

From The Word for Today...

Get ready to go!

'Get ready to cross the Jordan River into the land I am about to give them—to the Israelites.' Joshua 1:2 NIV

The words for you today are

1) Get ready. For forty years, Joshua had served Moses and been mentored by him; now he was ready to lead Israel into the promised land. This raises the all-important question: are you ready for the success you seek? The frustrating thing about preparation is sometimes it takes more time than the event you're preparing for. Are you self-disciplined? Are you up to date on your career or calling? Do you have the right relationships in place? Is your home life in order? Do you have strong character? As the old saying goes, 'You can claim to be surprised once; after that, you're unprepared!'

One author writes: 'Talented people are sometimes tempted to take shortcuts. Character prevents that. Talented people may feel superior and expect special privileges. Character helps them to know better. Talented people are praised for what others see them build. Character builds what's inside them. Talented people have the potential to be difference makers. Character makes a difference in them. Talented people are often a gift to the world. Character protects that gift.'

2) Go! God told Joshua, '*I will give you every place where you set your foot, as I promised Moses*' (Joshua 1:3 NIV). Don't be like Alice in *Alice's Adventures in Wonderland* who asked the Cheshire-Cat, 'Would you tell me, please, which way I ought to go from here?' 'That depends a good deal on where you want to get to,' said the Cat. 'I don't much care where—' said Alice. 'Then it doesn't matter which way you go,' said the Cat. To succeed, you must do the right things, moment by moment, day by day, following through with them in a consistent way.
