Reflection from Craig...

Love


The Apostle Paul says some pretty radical things, radical for our time but unbelievably radical for his time. In his day life was brutal, people died young and unless you were relatively well off your life was very difficult and unpredictable. This is what makes Paul's teaching on love so amazing, given that much of his audience were slaves or slave owners. The crux of his teaching is in verses 4-7 of 1 Corinthians 13 and it goes,

Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

Imagine you are a slave owner or slave and hear this. Or you are a woman, given that women were treated as property in those days. The bit that really grabs me is where it says love doesn't insist on its own way. Imagine that in a first century household where children, wives and slaves were all property of the man of the house. It's kind of mind blowing really, Paul saying to that guy you're a Christian now so you can't insist on your own way.

This is true for our day as well, how often in church meetings are there those who insist on their own way, or in families who do the same thing. Insisting on your own way, unless for very good reasons around safety and such is generally an indication of the need to control. People who need to control are mostly very insecure and as such are far more concerned with what makes them feel safe than they are for the common good. It is up to each of us to question ourselves, why do we need to insist on getting things our way, is it for the common good or is it driven by insecurity.

Choosing the way of love means we put the common good before our need except in a circumstance where a very bad decision is about to be made. So think about your motivation next time a group decision needs to be made, whose purposes are being served. In the end it's always best to serve the purpose of love.

From The Word for Today

PRAYER

'Lord, teach us to pray,' Luke 11:1 NKJV

Demonstrating an uncommon level of honesty, a well-known pastor says: 'Prayer is the biggest struggle I have ... It's difficult to maintain a consistent prayer life, and especially difficult to sustain the conviction that it does any good at times.'

Prayer doesn't come naturally for the majority of us. We know it's supposed to be a dialogue, but often it feels like a monologue. There is nothing worse than trying to talk with someone who won't talk back. We don't like to admit it, but often what we are really wondering about prayer is, 'How can I pray so that God will give me what I want?' One little boy was asked if he said his prayers every night. He replied, 'No, some nights I don't need anything.'

Prayer is not about the particular words you use or the length of time you spend praying. It's about getting acquainted. It's about building a relationship. If you have something to talk to someone about, you may say, 'We need to find somewhere we can talk.' You want to make sure you're heard, and that you hear what the other person has to say. When you eliminate the noise of this world, you maximise your ability to hear God. It shows God you're taking your relationship with Him seriously. The psalmist said, 'He who dwells in the secret place of the Most High shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty' (Psalm 91:1 NKJV). Do you have a 'secret place' where you can be alone with God? It can be anywhere. But you need a place where you can go and show you mean business with God.
